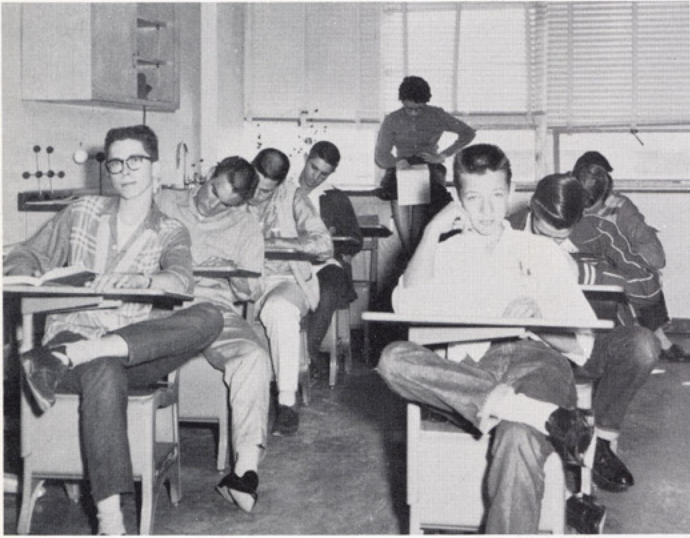
Mr. D. L. Davison, who had worked as one of our school custodians since September of this year, died suddenly December 9.

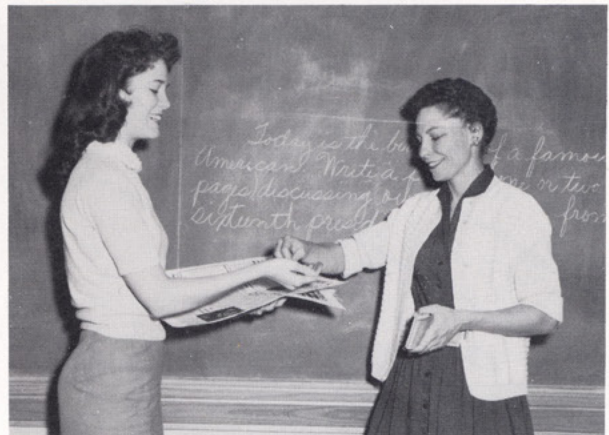
